Guidelines: Students who have illnesses or injuries outside of the Health Center, but on campus, will have access to quality emergency care.

Specifics:

1. Campus Safety (x 8111) should be notified of a serious accident or illness involving a member of the university community or campus visitor.
2. If the affected person can not be safely moved or if time is of the essence, they should not be brought to the Health Center. Campus safety will notify 911 and request medical assistance. The patient will be transported to the nearest emergency room at the discretion of the medical response team based on their medical evaluation. Mount St. Mary's Hospital will be the preferred hospital for evaluation and treatment due to its proximity to the university.
3. If the affected person's injury is minor, campus safety may transport them to Health Services via ambulation or vehicle for evaluation.
4. Campus Safety will complete a university safety report. They will keep one on file at Campus Safety and fax one to Health Services.
