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**Guidelines:** Transportation of students to local treatment facilities such as physician offices, urgent care centers, physical therapy appointments or emergency room for routine or non-urgent care is the sole responsibility of the student.

Students requiring emergent/life threatening medical treatment will be transported via EMS services to St. Mary's Hospital or Niagara Falls Memorial Medical Center on direction of clinic staff.

**Specifics:**

1. Public transportation is available for use by students seeking non-urgent transportation to off campus medical appointments, the emergency room and urgent care centers. Bus schedules are available at student health services or on-line at [www.nfta.com](http://www.nfta.com).
2. Students presenting to SHS with an emergent or life threatening condition will be evaluated, stabilized and transported to a higher level of care. Refer to clinic procedure and guidelines: *Health Center Emergencies*.
