Serious Misconduct and Division I Athletics Participation

PURPOSE:

Niagara University is committed to a culture of care and considers the dignity of the human person in forming a mission-driven community. This policy enhances the safety of Niagara University through the admission and enrollment process and is in accordance with the NCAA's policy on campus sexual violence.

SCOPE:

Niagara University's Policy on Serious Misconduct and Division I Athletics Participation requires all current and incoming student-athletes to annually attest to their compliance with screening questions regarding their conduct.

TERMS AND DEFINITIONS:

For the purpose of this policy, serious misconduct is defined as interpersonal violence, sexual violence, or other acts of violence. Student-athletes who have been found responsible, convicted, or pleaded no contest, may not be able to participate in Division I Athletics.

MAIN PROVISIONS:

All prospective and current student-athletes will complete the screening questions on an annual basis through the ARMS digital platform. The screening questions are included as part of this policy. The completion and review of this document is required before a student-athlete may begin actively participating. For student-athletes transferring from another institution, the former institution's Title IX officer must complete a transfer tracer stating if the prospective student-athlete was a respondent in a Title IX proceeding and the final decision or current status of the proceeding.

PROCEDURES:

The athletics compliance office will review all documents and a thorough review will be conducted on any student-athlete who answers "Yes" to any of the questions. Upon initial review, the athletics department's Senior Woman Administrator will refer the application to the Serious Misconduct review panel. The prospective or current student-athlete will be notified of the inquiry into their status as a prospective student-athlete at Niagara University.

The Serious Misconduct review panel will meeting within 10 business days of the notification and decide whether or not to allow for participation in Division I Athletics. The panel's decision and supporting report will be provided to the Director of Athletics. The Director of Athletics has five business days to support or refute the panel's decision and forward information to the University's final decision review panel for final decision. The Vice President for Diversity, Equity and Inclusion; the Vice President for Student Affairs; and the Vice President for Human Resources; and the Executive Vice President to render the final decision within five business days. The prospective or current student-athlete will be notified of the final decision by the Director of Athletics.

A serious misconduct advisory committee may assist athletics administration or the serious misconduct review panel during their deliberations but will not be a decision-making entity.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Serious Misconduct Review Panel

The serious misconduct review panel, with consultation from the University General Counsel's office, renders the initial decision on the application of the prospective student. The review panel will review all facts and information that has been provided based on the individual's circumstances.

The serious misconduct review panel is comprised of:

- Title IX Coordinator
- Dean of Students
- Faculty Athletics Representative
- Department of Athletics Senior Woman Administrator

Serious Misconduct Advisory Committee

The serious misconduct advisory committee may assist at any point throughout the process. The advisory committee will not have the authority to make decisions, however, they will advise based on expertise and situational circumstances.

Niagara's serious misconduct advisory committee is comprised of:

- Deputy Title IX Coordinator
- Director of Violence, Prevention & Education
- Mental Health Counselor, Student-Athlete Liaison
- Director Campus Safety

Screening Questions

Prior to participating in Division I Athletics, student-athletes must answer the following questions. This attestation will be made on an annual basis; however, student-athletes are under a continuing obligation with respect to this attestation. If a student-athlete's answer to any of these questions change, the student-athlete must immediately notify the Director of Athletics.

At a minimum, each prospective student-athlete is required to answer the following questions before being able to actively participate:

1. Do you have any criminal or juvenile delinquency charges pending against you? Yes No

3. Have you been convicted of, pleaded guilty to, pleaded no contest or been found a delinquent to any crime or delinquency involving:
